When asked what her ideal storytelling program would look like she said "telling folktales to a group of upper elementary (3 rd, 4 th, and 5 th grade) students. At that age they can understand the humor or sorrow of a situation without it having to be explained to them."

One of her favorite memories of being a school librarian is every year, for a week in October, she would tell stories to the students.
